Shirley Rakes Ussery's husband, William (Bill) Ussery, 84, passed away March 2020 in Lakeland, FL surrounded by his loving family. Born in Detroit, Mich., Bill and his family moved to Coral Gables, Fla. in 1939 where he grew up and graduated from Coral Gables High School and then went on to the University of Florida where he said destiny led him to meet the love of his life, Shirley Rakes from Saint Petersburg. Bill and Shirley started their 64-year journey of married life in Coral Gables where the young couple raised three children while Bill opened his first franchise automobile dealership at 21 years old. He would go on to open multiple new and used car dealerships in Florida and Georgia. In mid-1970 Bill moved his family to Savannah, Ga., where for 30 years had Bill Ussery Volkswagen, Porsche, Audi, Subaru dealership. He was president of the Savannah New Car Dealer Association and served on the dealer advisory boards for Volkswagen and Porsche. He served on the Board of Directors for the American Automobile Association South and the Georgia Automobile Dealer Association. Bill was an elder at the Independent Presbyterian Church and was a founding member of the Skidaway Island Presbyterian Church.

Subsequently, Bill and Shirley moved to Lake Wales, FL.



James Lyn Provo, 85, passed to Heaven July 12, 2021. He was born in Cleveland, Ohio, but lived most of his life in St. Petersburg, Florida. He graduated from SPHS, received a B.S. in Chemistry and a M.S. in Nuclear Science from Georgia Institute of Technology, and a degree in Electronics from SPJC (now St. Petersburg College). He worked for General Electric/Department of Energy in Largo, Florida for 33 years and retired from Sandia National Lab in Albuquerque, New Mexico. He also worked some at Los Alamos National Lab. He is a fellow of the American Vacuum Society (AVS) and was editor of their newsletter for several years as well as editor of the newsletter of the International Union of Vacuum Science, Technique, & Applications (IUVSTA). He was also AVS photographer for 45 years. At one time, Lyn was President of the Tampa Bay Running Council, and had joined local running clubs. He finished many marathons, including New York, seven times; and Boston, two times. He is survived by his loving wife of 59 years, Susanne Gould Provo, and brother Wade A. Provo's family in Idaho,

Joanne Bolton Knight, 85, of Nashville, TN died peacefully on Sunday, July 18, 2021. Joanne was born February 26, 1936, in St. Petersburg, Joanne graduated from St. Petersburg High School in 1954 and Stetson University in 1958 where she earned her BA degree and was a member of Alpha Xi Delta sorority and a traveling member of the Stetson Choir.

She married Alfred Sidney Knight in 1958 and spent the next five years with Sid at Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut where she taught history at Milford High School. A move to Ft. Collins, CO and Colorado State University encouraged more volunteer work and she was influential in establishing the Commission on Aging in Ft Collins.

Her family moved to Nashville in 1969 where her three children, Shannon, Kyle and Courtney, were raised and where she continued her volunteer work with the schools.

In 1975, Joanne founded and was president and CEO of two home care companies which provided medical assistance to the elderly, administration as Vice President and served Baptist Hospital for fourteen years.

A confirmed Episcopalian, she was a communicant of Christ Church Cathedral where she has served in many positions and was heavily involved in missions. She also completed a four-year program of Education for Ministry sponsored by the University of the South at Sewanee. Joanne is survived by a daughter, two sons and their families, along with a brother Bob Bolton and Sister Sue Brasington. Services were held at her church on July 25, 2021.
